Discussion/Report:

There were no Wet Weather Flow Management Program Committee meetings held since the last report to the SAM Board. At the June 22, 2009 SAM Board meeting, staff will present the Board with a proposal from SRT Consultants for the Design of the WWFMP project.

SAM is awaiting decisions on three potential grant funding sources for this project:

1. Clean Beaches Initiative, Prop. 84: Bond funding from the State for projects to prevent further beach contamination on the coast. Up to \$750,000 of the project cost can be funded through this source. The beaches on the Mid-Coast have received an "F" rating this year in terms of contamination, therefore there is a strong reasons to believe that the importance of this project will be further elevated.
2. Federal Funding: Congresswoman Anna Eshoo's office has informed SAM that \$550,000 were included in the appropriations' request for this project.
3. Federal Funding: Bay Area Business Council will publish its list on June 1, 2009. SAM requested the entire project, up to \$3,000,000 to be funded.

SAM has been notified that the Granada Sanitary District and the San Mateo County Harbor District have reached agreement on the sale of the land on which the project will be built. This is an integral step closer to construction of this project.
